2018 OBSERVANCE OF THE NATIONAL AWARENESS WEEK

FOR THE PREVENTION OF CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE AND

The Presidential Proclamation No. 731 series of 1996 declares the 2nd week of February of every year as the "National Awareness Week for the Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation" or also known as "Child Sexual Abuse Awareness Week (CSAAW)".

This years' observance will be on **February 11-17, 2018** with the theme "**WE ARE THE SOLUTION!**" The theme engages every individual to create change in their communities and make a meaningful impact in addressing sexual violence.

In this regard, all local government units are enjoined to support the observance of CSAAW by conducting activities, such as but not limited to the following:

- 1. Hanging of advocacy streamers in strategic places;
- 2. Orientation on preventing child sexual abuse and exploitation; and
- 3. CSAAW forum.









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1. Types of Sexually Abused Reported Cases Served in the Philippines from 2012 to 2016










3. Comparison of Male and Female Reported Cases Served

Data from recent researches



1 in 5 (17.1%) children experienced some form of sexual violence in childhood.





Males were significantly more likely than females experience sexual violence at home and in school.1






Sexual violence against children most often happen at home and during dating.2 Lack of supervision, single headed households and absent parents increase the risks for sexual violence against children in the home.3



Brothers and cousins are commonly perpetrators of sexual violence in the home. Among male victims, frequently cited perpetrators are cousins, fathers and brothers. While neighbor was identified as the most common perpetrator in the community.⁴



2 in 5 (43.8%) children have experiences cyberviolence, either through the internet or cellphone.5 Risky online behavior and lack of supervision when using the internet exposes children to online sexual solicitation and grooming.6
